A Message from Your Pastor...

Dear Friends in Christ,

Picture a blacksmith, a glass blower, a potter, or a carpenter. Typically we don't see individuals like this working every day. But if we visit a historic village or go to various "Old Time" festivals, we have the opportunity to see the handiwork of skilled individuals as they strive to mold, sculpt, and build beautiful creations. It is fascinating to watch a skilled worker.

The ease with which the individual accomplishes a task—the knowledge, the experience, the patience, the confidence—all those characteristics make it fascinating to watch the individual work.

Scripture speaks about the handiwork of God. In Isaiah 64:8, we read, "But now, O Lord, you are our Father; we are the clay, and you are our potter." This passage, along with passages like Genesis 2:7, Jeremiah 18:6, and Psalm 139, describe us as being God's handiwork. Picture that! You are the handiwork of a skilled worker who has the knowledge, experience, confidence, skill, and patience to mold and sculpt a beautiful creation. God is the potter; we are the clay. God continues to mold and sculpt us as He cares and desires. And if we are honest with ourselves, we usually find it much more enjoyable to watch the process of molding and sculpting rather than to be the one who is molded and sculpted. Sometimes we can be a little rough around the edges. Sometimes we aren't quite ready to be molded and formed, but God as the master craftsman has the patience to continue to work on us.

God can mold and shape us in many different ways. He can mold us through the various experiences, challenges, struggles, and opportunities that we have. Really, He could mold and shape us in any way that He so chooses and desires – there are many ways to add water to the clay to make it pliable. But one way God has promised to mold and shape us is through His Word. Through His Word, by the power of the Holy Spirit, God works in our lives to mold and shape us. Through His Word, we learn how we fall short of His glory when we sin. Through His Word, we are forgiven. Through His Word, we learn how to live as His redeemed children.

This month, we celebrate the Reformation. We remember and celebrate what Martin Luther did on October 31, 1517, when he nailed his 95 theses on the Castle Church door in Wittenberg, Germany. He wanted the church to stand on the truth of God's Word alone – a Word that shapes, molds, and leads us as God's children and God's church. Along with Reformation, several of our young people who have completed confirmation instruction will stand before God's altar and confess their faith in Jesus at the 10:30am worship service on October 29th. They have been molded and shaped by God's Word – taught by parents and you as a congregation. They will also promise to continue to be fed with God's Word in worship and Bible study. It's a promise to continually be shaped and molded by God.

Last month we celebrated Rally Day, the official kick-off for Sunday School and another season of Bible studies. I would encourage you to get connected with a group and be in Bible study together. Join fellow sisters and brothers in Christ as they too are molded and shaped by the hands of the Potter.



Whatever is honorable...

"Honor your father and your mother," (this is the first commandment with a promise), *"that it may go well with you and that you may live long in the land"* (*Ephesians 6:2-3*).

These words of Paul resonate with me as we move on from focusing on God's TRUTH in September to looking at the word HONOR in October. Throughout this section of Ephesians, Paul encourages the church at Ephesus to consider their personal relationships and to consider how they can HONOR others above themselves. He begins to point us toward this truth at the beginning of chapter 5 when he writes, *"Therefore be imitators of God, as beloved children. And walk in love, as Christ loved us..."* (v. 1-2).

What better way to HONOR those around us than to be imitators of Christ and show them the same kind of love that He showed to us? Over the next two months, we will have a number of opportunities to HONOR each other; through being present with each other, serving others, and sharing our gifts, time, and talents.

On October 6-7, youth in 8th grade and up will head to Muddy Cluster for our fall retreat. MAKE A DIFFERENCE: GIVE A GIFT TO THE TRINITY SCHOOL ENDOWMENT FUND!

For most parents, sending their children to Trinity Lutheran School to receive a quality, Christian education comes at a huge financial sacrifice. For some families it is not a reality without the help of others. Did you know that Trinity Lutheran School has a new endowment fund designed to provide needs-based scholarships to students? The best part is that your gift to the endowment fund will *help nurture children in the faith for generations to come!*

In addition to the blessing of providing a gift to a self-perpetuating endowment fund to help students, the Trinity School Endowment Fund qualifies for the *Montana Endowment Tax Credit*. Montana is one of only four states that has passed legislation to offer this unique tax credit. This law provides for:

Planned Gifts (Applies to individual or business entity taxpayers)

Credit against state income tax liability in the amount of 40% of the present value of any planned gift to a permanent endowment of a Montana charity up to a maximum amount of \$10,000 per year per taxpayer (\$20,000 for joint filers). Individuals and joint-filing taxpayers are required to convey their gifts through a planned gift. Gift annuities, charitable trusts and estate gifts all fall under the definition of a planned gift. Charitable gift annuities, in most cases easily established, are the most often-used planned gift for this purpose.

Outright Gifts (*Applies to corporations, small business corporations, partnership or limited liability company taxpayers*)

Credit against state income tax liability in the amount of 20% of the present value of any outright gift by a business entity to a permanent endowment of a Montana charity up to a maximum of \$10,000 per year.
