A Message from Your Pastor...

Dear Friends of Trinity.

On this particular Sunday morning, I was walking into the narthex of a church, trying to get my bearings. I glanced around and found the sanctuary, the fellowship hall, and the donut tables, but what I really needed – rather, what one of my children really needed – was a restroom. I had never been to this church before, and outside of my immediate family, I didn't know anyone. I was a visitor.

My family and I were attending this church to celebrate the baptism of my wife's niece. After inquiring where the restrooms were from an usher, I found a place to stand along the side wall of the narthex next to my in-laws and family. This spot seemed ideal as we were not disrupting the flow of people moving about, but we were close enough not to miss anything.

I found the moment quite fascinating. Standing there, observing people interact and converse with one another before church, I began wondering who, if anyone, was going to talk with us, the visitors. People saw us. Some people smiled at us. Many people walked right by us without any acknowledgement at all. Everyone (it seemed) knew we were newcomers. Finally one friendly lady came towards us and greeted us. She introduced herself, welcomed us, briefly talked with us and shared in the joy of the baptism. Then another person came over and briefly said hi, and then another. Before I knew it, 20 minutes had passed, and it was time for church. It only took 3 people – 3 conversations – to quickly pass the time and help us feel welcome in an unfamiliar place.

At His birth, Jesus didn't have a warm welcome. Luke 2:7 tells us, "And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in swaddling cloths and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn." (emphasis added) The King of Creation, who left His home in heaven, was not welcomed to this earth with a warm house and a soft bed. Rather, his welcome was a manger, His bed made of straw. And who was there to greet Him? Mary and Joseph, of course. But the first visitors were shepherds, who were "out in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night" (Luke 2:8). I wonder what Mary and Joseph thought when these men from the field came to see their newborn infant. I seriously doubt those shepherds ran home for a shower before greeting this new baby. I don't even think they used hand sanitizer. Yet they were still welcomed to glimpse and gaze upon this baby, their Savior Jesus.

This time of year, our congregation sees lots of people. Most are familiar with the church, knowing where to go and recognizing familiar faces. Still, many are visitors. Unfamiliar with where to go, what to do, who to speak to. How do we welcome these newcomers? With Christ's Love.

It's easy to smile and make eye contact, yet remain distant and disconnected. It's much more meaningful to take a few minutes, stretch out your hand and say, "Hi, my name is....I'm so glad you're here." In so doing, you are welcoming our guests to gaze upon the love of their Savior, Jesus.

This month, as we prepare to celebrate the birth of our Savior Jesus, we will be gathering in worship on Wednesdays evenings at 6:30. Before worship, we share a meal together at 5pm. Many times, we have guests and visitors who

join us for the meal. Continue to be the loving, welcoming, Body of Christ that you are. In fact, just this past week, a newcomer who had been with us for about 3 weeks and initially was looking to join our congregation said, "I really appreciate how kind your congregation has been to me. They are very welcoming." Keep up the good work in the name and love of Jesus, who welcomes us.

RECIPE

Mom's Sweet Potato Bake

3 c. cold mashed sweet potatoes
(Prepared without milk or butter – you may also use canned yams)

1 c. sugar
1 c. sugar
1/2 c. milk
1/2 c. milk
1/2 c. packed brown sugar
1/2 c. chopped pecans
1/2 c. chopped pecans
1/4 c. all-purpose flour
1 tsp. vanilla extract
2 tbsp. cold butter/margarine

In a mixing bowl, beat sweet potatoes, sugar, milk, butter, eggs, salt and vanilla until smooth. Transfer to a greased 2-qt. baking dish. In a small bowl, combine brown sugar, pecans, and flour; cut in butter until crumbly. Sprinkle over potato mixture. Bake, uncovered, at 325 degrees for 45-50 minutes or until golden brown. Yield: 8-10 servings


