A Message from Your Pastor...

Dear Friends of Trinity,

Christmas is the time we celebrate God's gift of His Son Jesus, born in a stable in Bethlehem a little more than 2,000 years ago. It was a gift God first promised to Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden when sin broke into the world. It was a promise that God's people looked forward to with anticipation as they waited for the Messiah to come. Throughout the Old Testament, and even in the Gospels, Scripture records people watching and waiting for their savior. Until, as Luke 2:6-7 records:

"The time came for her to give birth. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in swaddling cloths and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn."

At the right time, God sent Jesus to be born. Jesus is God's gift of a savior for the world – for us! Celebrations of Christmas today often include the exchanging of gifts: gifts given and received between family members, friends, co-workers, and even between complete strangers (think Toy Drives and Mitten Trees). Yes, at Christmas many gifts are exchanged for many reasons. As Christians, exchanging gifts can provide an opportunity to give witness to the best gift of all, God's Son Jesus.

This Christmas, I would encourage you to think of another gift God has given you, the gift of faith. It is faith that clings to the promise that the baby named Jesus, born in Bethlehem, who lived a perfect life and died and rose again, is your Savior. Please add that date and time to your calendar. It will be a time of thanksgiving and celebration of God's gift of faithful service and ministry through the Rinderknechts. But you certainly don't have to wait until then.

Christmas is a time of giving gifts. Maybe you can give a gift to Pastor Rinderknecht – a card, a phone call, a cup of coffee – a gift of conversation that says thank you for his faithful service in pointing us back to the best gift of all, God's Son, Jesus.

In October we completed a major upgrade to our church boiler system. This included removing the original boiler from the church office and tying our office system to our main church boilers. We also updated our HVAC controls, allowing us to schedule heating to happen only when the church is in use and creating efficiencies in our energy consumption. This was a planned project and the total cost to complete it was more than \$25K. However, updating this system will save us money over time and eliminates one of our greatest potential liabilities by removing our reliance on heat from a 70-year-old boiler.



Also, the Board of Elders is currently forming a call committee to address our upcoming pastoral vacancy.
