A Message from Your Pastor...

Dear Friends of Trinity,

It is hard to believe that May is here. When you think of the activities of May, what comes to mind? There are many activities in this month. Schools are wrapping up the year. There are graduations. College students are moving home or to careers. It is a month where people transition from spring to summer, typically over the Memorial Day weekend. Summer vacation and plans begin to commence. I'm sure the list could go on.

One thing I think of during the month of May is racing. Allow me to explain. I grew up in a small Southern Indiana town called Seymour. Seymour is about an hour away from two big races in May. The first race happens on the first weekend of May about an hour south of Seymour in Louisville, Kentucky. It's the Kentucky Derby, and people begin to celebrate this 2-minute horse race two weeks beforehand. It kicks off with "Thunder Over Louisville" – an air show during the day and a 30-minute fireworks show set to music at night (check out "Thunder Over Louisville" on youtube.com if you're curious). Then, of course, race day, locally known as Derby Day.

The second race I always look forward to in May is about an hour north of Seymour in Indianapolis. It's the Indianapolis 500 which takes place on Memorial Day weekend. Much like the Kentucky Derby, almost every day for two weeks before the green flag drops, there is activity at the track. The excitement builds as teams arrive, drivers and cars sometimes change, practice times begin to roll in, and finally the field is set after qualifying. Then it's race day!

Race day is certainly exciting as thousands of fans gather to watch the race. But for most of those fans, it's only one day: Race Day. But for those who are competing, it's more than one day. For the horse trainers and jockeys, for the drivers and crew teams, they have been focused on one thing -

winning the race. They have put in the time in practice and preparation for Race Day. Why? So they can win the prize.

It's the same for us as Christians. In Holy Scripture, specifically in the New Testament, the life of a Christian is described as a race. 1 Corinthians 9:24 says, "Do you not know that in a race all the runners run but only one gets the prize? Run in such a way as to get the prize." Or 2 Timothy 4:7, "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith." Lastly in Hebrews 12:1, "Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us."

God's Word not only encourages us, but also strengthens us to "run the race" with faith, and endurance and "in such a way as to get the prize." To do that, to "run in a way that gets the prize" takes time and practice and focus. Just like the teams and people who compete in the Derby or the 500, so also we as Christians need to be focused on the prize: eternal life with Jesus. That prize has been won for us by Jesus' death and resurrection. We need to be focused on faithfully following Him as we spend time in God's Word every day. We should be spending time together in worship, with brothers and sisters in Christ who are running the race with us, being refreshed and strengthen with God's Word and Sacrament. These are the gifts that prepare us for "Race Day."

That day, "Race Day," could be any day our faith is challenged, or any day we face a struggle. That day could be the day God calls us home for eternity. May the Holy Spirit empower and strengthen us to "run with endurance the race that is set before us," no matter what day it is.

Meet the Member

LEW & ROSEMARY LEHMAN

Lew Lehman was born December 11, 1924 in Garland, Wyoming. He was raised in 'Lockwood Flats' where his parents farmed. He attended 8 years of school at the Lockwood 'Pine Hill' School, then attended Senior High School. Rosemary was born December 1, 1929 in Fromberg, MT, and attended school in that area.

A special memory Lew had from school was a snowball fight. "One warm winter day all the kids – about 16 or 18 kids, were out throwing snowballs at the girls who were shielded behind a snow fort with the teacher....who stuck her head out from behind the fort in time to get hit in the eye with a snowball that broke her glasses! Luckily there was no serious damage to the eye, and no punishment was given to the guy who threw the snowball."

Lew shared that his parents were born in Russia. His father was about twelve years old when the family came to America. After working for the Ford car factory a number of years, his parents moved west and farmed. Lew's father and mother began their life together in Wyoming – then moved to Montana when Lew was about 1 year old.

Lew and Rosemary were married November 4, 1949 at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Bridger, MT, where Rosemary was confirmed in 1945. Rosemary was a teacher during her working career. She was affectionately referred to as one of the best dressed teachers in the District. Lew worked in banks most of the time – for over 30 years.

Except for a 3-year period when Lew worked at a bank out of town, the Lehmans have been active members of Trinity. Both have served in many church positions. Lew was a long-time Lay Minister and was always available to serve at funerals after his retirement. He also picked up the church's recycling for many years. Lew has many



relatives at Trinity: John Michel, Mary Essman, Olga Fox, Paul Kober, Polly Vernes, Dennis Emmerick & Errol Seiffert.

Lew & Rosemary enjoy visiting friends and relatives and playing bridge. They have also enjoyed traveling through the years. Their favorite sound is polka music and little kids playing. Their least favorite chore is vacuuming. When asked what one word describes him best, Lew responded, "Depends on who you ask!"

Lew said he couldn't pick a favorite verse because he loves them all, but his favorite hymns include: "I Know That My Redeemer Lives," "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God," and many others! He recently picked up the hymnal at home, paged through all the hymns he recognized, and remembered the melodies to them all!

Lew & Rosemary recently moved to Denver, CO, to be near family. (Their new address is: 1001 Yale Ave., Apt. 230, Denver, CO 80210-5885.) On his note to the church, Lew said, "We miss Trinity Lutheran Church and pray our Lord continues to bless Trinity's pastors, members and all our friends."
