Dear Friends of Trinity,

In the first 20 years of my ministry, the month of Thanksgiving was not November. Can you guess what month it was? You might know that I spent those years in Canada. So that should give you a hint... maybe. Well, in Canada, October is the month when they celebrate Thanksgiving. Perhaps you already knew that Canadians celebrate Thanksgiving Day on the second Monday of October. 

that He has been there always over all the years. After all, that is what He promised!

GET READY TO LAUNCH INTO GOD'S WORD THIS WINTER!

Earlier this summer my good friend Pastor Andrew Jones (First Lutheran, Concord, CA) texted me and asked if I could do him a favor. "Will you be part of the launch team for my first book from CPH this fall?" he wrote. "Of course!" I said, without really asking what the book was about or what my responsibilities would be. Knowing Andy, I knew the book would be thoughtful and well-written; a book I'd like to read regardless of topic. When he shared with me the title of the book, *Ten Questions to Ask Every Time You Read the Bible*, I got even more excited for what I had signed up for.

Early in September I received my advance copy to begin reading, and I began thinking about how I might use Andy's new book in my personal life as well as ministry here at Trinity. As I read it, I began to recognize what a great tool it could be to help facilitate discussion around God's Word, specifically in a small group setting. The book doesn't just share the ten questions and move on; it digs so much deeper than that, providing practical examples for how to utilize each question in our study of Scripture. As I anticipated, Andy's writing is thoughtful, approachable, and, most importantly, impactful - whether you've been reading the Bible for years or are brand new to studying Scripture, you'll walk away with an understanding for how



to read for context and ask meaningful questions every time you sit down with God's Word. I have already seen these ten questions impact my daily study as well as my preparations for faith classes, chapel talks, and youth group devotions, and I strongly recommend adding it to your toolkit for reading Scripture.

The book is currently available for pre-order through CPH's webstore (cph.org) as well as on Amazon with a release date of November 8.
