# A Message from Your Pastor...

Dear Friends of Trinity,

We're all familiar with blueprints. Those important pieces of paper that describe how a building should be built. The various contractors – the construction, plumbing, electrical crews, and others – need those blueprints in order to know what to build where so the building looks and works like it's supposed to. Without blueprints, a building could be constructed, but its usefulness would be diminished. It would certainly lack organization and effectiveness. Yes, we are familiar with blueprints. We know they are important.

Just as blueprints are important to the construction of a building, so also a constitution is important in how an organization operates to accomplish its mission. Without organization and structure, a group of people could gather to do something, but – like a building built without blueprints – their usefulness and effectiveness would be diminished. That's why people at Trinity Lutheran Church and School have been working for the past several years to develop a new constitution and bylaws. Perhaps you have heard about this work.

Some of that work included Bible Studies and a seminar back in January of 2016, which talked about our need to update and change our constitution that was written more than 35 years ago – back when Trinity had one pastor and a part-time secretary. Much of this work became the responsibility of the Constitution Committee, and many thanks to Ted Kober who helped develop the draft for the new constitution. This work included committees and boards evaluating their roles and responsibilities to further the ministry of Trinity. In response to the feedback of committees and boards, adjustments were made to the constitution. Then there was the All Boards Meeting in May of this year, and through that discussion, further changes were made that clarified concerns and helped develop a document that board leaders and members were comfortable with in moving forward with ministry at Trinity.

Although writing a constitution and working through the bylaws is not fun and exciting work, it is important work. It is in this tedious work that I have appreciated the lively conversations, the visioning and sharing of ideas, the sorting through of the details by many people, and having Jonathan Boll keep track of it all so that the process would keep moving forward. Those have been good things. But what I have appreciated the most about this process is the willingness of people to work together for the good of Trinity Lutheran Church and School in proclaiming God's Word. That cooperation, that "working togetherness" became a key aspect of the new constitution. Whether that working together will be with and through staff members, or Boards or Ministry Teams, or Town Hall Meetings – all new things in the new constitution – it is important for our church and school and all her members to work together to further God's Kingdom.

Isn't that what a constitution – just like a set of blueprints – is supposed to do? It helps organize everyone to work together to accomplish a common goal. It is our hope that this new constitution will help us work together to share Jesus with people. It's not official yet, the new constitution still needs to be approved by our District; that's where it's at now. Then it will come before the congregation for review, discussion, and hopefully approval at a Voter's Meeting. More information should be coming soon; please be looking for that.

When it comes to structure and constitution and bylaws, those things can look different from congregation to congregation. They don't specifically

matter. What does matter, though, is that "God so loved the world, that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life." That message is what Trinity Lutheran Church and School is here to proclaim, as faithfully and clearly as possible.
