# A Message from Your Pastor...

Dear Friends of Trinity,

About a year ago, something happened to me that took me by surprise. I can't say that it was a pleasant surprise, but it made me re-evaluate something about myself. (Now that I got your attention, read on...)

One day after shopping, I picked up an awkward package from a cart to put into my car. A "kind" stranger half my age ran up to me and asked if he could help! He snatched the package out of my hand and placed it gently in my trunk with a big smile that said, "There, I have done my good deed for the day!" A bit irritated, I thought to myself, "I was handling this just fine! I'm not helpless!"

A similar occurrence happened again this summer! I was at the Denver airport walking on one of those moving sidewalks. When I got close to the end with my suitcase in tow, a "kind" stranger lurched forward as if to save me from wiping out at the end where the moving sidewalk hits the stationary floor. "Be careful, let me help you!" He grabbed my arm like he was helping some old cripple guy land safely.

Both of these events caused me to ask the question, "Do I really look that old and helpless? I'm only 63!" (There, now you know how old I am!) I have been a capable person all of my life. I know what hard physical labor is all about. I worked on construction since I was 18. In those days, I could run up the stairs of a ten story building in less than one minute without breathing hard! Even as a pastor, I am still active on my acreage, always building something, carrying hay bales, and maintaining the property!

Actually, the real issue was my bruised pride! I have to look in the mirror, really look, and realize that yes, I am getting older! I don't have the energy I used to have. I experience some aches and pains that I never knew in my youth. With God's help, I need to set aside my pride and accept the changes that time always brings. (I can almost hear what some of my older friends and members are thinking, "Pastor, you are still young, you have a long way to go yet." Thanks, folks, but I can accept the truth that I am getting older.)

I also can learn to receive help from others. I think this is a lesson that we all need to learn no matter what our physical condition or age. Doesn't God intend that we help one another? That means that we are to offer help to those in need and that we ought to receive help from others graciously.

At the end of Paul's letter to the Philippians he speaks graciously of receiving help from others. "...I rejoiced greatly in the Lord that at last you renewed your concern for me. Indeed, you were concerned, but you had no opportunity to show it...you sent me aid more than once when I was in need." (Philippians 4:10&16)


I'm writing on this subject of receiving help because of some conversations I have had recently with one of our members whom you may or may not know: Linda Flechsig. Linda was born with the condition called Cerebral Palsy. This condition affects the physical function primarily. Linda's mind is sharp, but she has difficulties in movement and speech. Linda was expressing some of the frustrations that I spoke about above where people "jump in" to help when help

was not necessarily needed. I have expressed to Linda the importance of receiving help graciously from those who care. She also expressed to me that it would be helpful to her to have people ask if she needed help and be patient with her because she is a bit slow to answer.

May the Lord help us to love and serve one another!



FINANCIAL UPDATE: We finished our 2017-2018 fiscal year with an overall net loss of \$13,605. While we kept expenses under budget, we received less school revenue than we had projected. July was the start of our new fiscal year and, as expected, we spent more than we brought in during the month. The good news is that we did not need to use our line of credit to get us through what is traditionally our leanest month We receive a large of the year. amount of school revenue in August and our financial picture improves dramatically. This year's budget calls for a modest 3% increase in general fund contributions. Please prayerfully consider how God is calling you to help meet our ongoing ministry obligations. In the coming months we will also be making a concerted push to pay off our Phase 1 Expansion project, so please consider being a part of this as you consider your giving this fiscal year.
